The Town of Buffalo Gap has high radionuclide's in our well, and remediation is not feasible, so we have switched to a rural water system for our water needs. It is known that this experimental process can have a devastating affect on a region's water source.

It is the general consensus that the citizens of Buffalo Gap, along with the Town body, are not willing to allow Powertech, or any such company, pollute the aquifers of our region through such an extraction process.
