URANIUM MINING IS STILL A THREAT TO COLORADO

When Governor Ritter signed HB 08-1161 in May of '08, requiring uranium mining companies to prove that they can prevent accidental releases of radionuclides and heavy metals into our groundwater and leave the water as clean as they found it, a lot of people thought that our water now was protected. Not so. It was only the first step. The next step is to draft the rules that will be used to enforce the law.

Your donations are very much needed at this time. State agencies will now draft rules, followed by one or more public hearings. Expert testimony is imperative at this stage, and that costs money. It is critical that the rules are written so we are protected as the law intended. Mining companies will do what they can to weaken the law and are prepared to spend what it takes.
